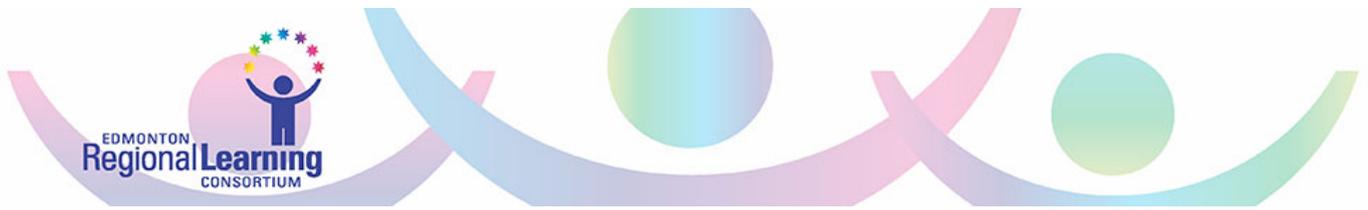
About this Learning Opportunity

Details

The series will begin with a half day orientation session on October 16, 2018, followed up with four half-day visits to Edmonton area schools (a combination of elementary, junior high, and high schools) to view exemplary leadership in action. The school visits will provide you with the opportunity to:

- listen to a short presentation by the school leader(s)
- engage in a guided tour of the school
- dialogue with the school leaders through small group discussions
- learn about cultural ceremonies, as well as community and classroom resources
- reflect on what was seen, heard and experienced to the LQS and TQS
- reflect on implications for developing and applying Indigenous Foundational Knowledge in your own context

As part of this series, you will be asked to 'try' at least one idea or strategy at your own school and share your experience at a celebration of learning on our final day together. Note: our final day will begin at 9:00 a.m. to provide time for celebration, sharing and learning from each other.
